Final State Exam (FSE)

The Final State Exam is a comprehensive verification of the ability to elaborate on a given topic systematically and independently in the form of a Diploma Thesis and to apply knowledge and skills acquired in the study programme within the topics stated in the **1FAN** syllabus.

Students work on their Diploma Thesis in cooperation with one of the supervising departments (KBP, KFOP, KFÚA, KMTP, KMÚ, KVF). At the same time, students must complete a diploma seminar at this department.

The condition for the FSE is the acquisition of all credits in the structure prescribed by the recommended study plan, except the credits for the FSE and the preparation and proper submission of the final thesis.
